1. NMCCD Annual Meeting

The NM Coalition of Conservation Districts (NMCCD) will hold this year's annual meeting on July 27 at the Bodega Burger restaurant in Socorro, NM. Lunch will be provided.

Each member district is invited to give a short verbal or written update of their activities over the past year; likewise for partner agencies and organizations. In addition to several agenda items pertaining to SWCD operations and roles, we have also scheduled a highly regarded guest speaker. More details will be forthcoming when the agenda is finalized.

2. NMDA to Hold Public Rule Hearings across New Mexico

The New Mexico Department of Agriculture will hold public hearings in four locations across the state to discuss the adoption and amendment of two rules.

The hearings will be held to propose the repeal and adoption of 21.15.1 NMAC – "Organic Agriculture," and amendments to 21.34.3 NMAC "Pasteurized Milk Ordinance," and receive public comment on each proposal.

The hearings will be as follows:

In Las Cruces at the New Mexico Department of Agriculture, on Wednesday, July 5, 2017 from 1–2 p.m., and 2:30–3:30 p.m.

In Portales at the Roosevelt County Extension Office on Thursday, July 6, 2017 from 2–3 p.m., and 3:30–4:30 p.m.

In Santa Fe at the State Capitol building in room 326, on Friday, July 7, 2017 from 8–9 a.m., and 9:30–10:30 a.m.

In Albuquerque at the Bernalillo County Extension Office, on Friday, July 7, 2017 from 1–2 p.m., and 2:30–3:30 p.m.

During the Organic Agriculture hearings, the new fee structure for the Department's Organic Program will be proposed.

During the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance hearings amendments will be proposed. These amendments add a reference to additional documents that are used to regulate milk and milk products in New Mexico.

The Organic rule hearings will be held first at each location, with the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance rule hearings to follow.

4. CWMA Grant Opportunity

Pre-Proposal Due Date: Wednesday, July 12 by 11:59 PM Eastern Time Full Proposal Due Date: Tuesday, September 19 by 11:59 PM Eastern Time

The Pulling Together Initiative program is inviting applications for competitive grant funding to promote the conservation of natural habitats by preventing, managing or eradicating invasive and noxious plant species. In 2017, the program will award grants to develop or advance Cooperative Weed Management Areas (CWMAs) and Cooperative Invasive Species Management Areas (CISMAs).

Approximately \$850,000 is expected to be available for grant awards in 2017. The program is a partnership between the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, the Bureau of Land Management, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the U.S. Forest Service.

Local bodies that do not qualify for the tiered system are due May 15; local bodies that qualify for the tiered system pursuant to Subsections A and B of 2.2.2.16 NMAC are due July 1.

AUP reports should be completed and submitted to the NM State Auditor by December 15.

11. Review of Certain National Monuments - Opportunity for Comment

According to the Federal Register, "The U.S. Department of the Interior is conducting review of certain National Monuments designated or expanded since 1996 under the Antiquities Act of 1906 in order to implement Executive Order 13792 of April 26, 2017." The Executive Order "directs the Secretary to conduct a review of all Presidential designations or expansions of designations...made since January 1, 1996, where the designation covers more than 100,000 acres...." Topics for consideration are whether coordination with stakeholders was adequate, if the Antiquities Act was being properly applied, and the effects of designated lands on multiple uses and economic development among many other things (please refer to the Federal Register notice for additional information). The two National Monuments that are being reviewed in New Mexico are the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument and the Rio Grande del Norte National Monument. Comments are due by July 10, 2017.
